Sound Discoveries: Exploring Vibrations and Volume

Year 4 has been immersed in the fascinating world of sound! They've been experimenting and learning, using a drum and some rice to see sound in action, exploring how different levels of force can alter sound vibrations and subsequently, the sound we hear.

The students observed the distinct differences when the drum was hit gently versus when it was struck with force. A gentle hit resulted in lesser vibrations of the drum skin, causing the rice to jump minimally and producing a quieter sound. In contrast, hitting the drum forcefully led to greater vibrations, louder sounds, and higher jumps from the rice!



This hands-on experiment allowed the students to visibly perceive the relationship between vibration and sound, giving them a practical understanding of how sound works. It was an exciting and educational journey, offering each student an insight into the intriguing science of sound.

European Day of Languages



Diving into Dynamic Dynasties



Year 5 worked together earlier this week to create a Dynamic Dynasties timeline for their topic and class display. Children first looked at our knowledge organisers to determine the order of the dynasties in ancient China.

Across the classroom, pupils were given cards with names and dates on, and then had to piece the timeline together by sharing the information they had with one another, finding their matching cards and then organising the information in the correct order. Great work, Year 5!
